#### Scholarship Manager, New Site Launched for Foundation Scholarships

Working with the leadership of the Financial Aid Departments of Yuba College and Woodland Community College a new online program – *Scholarship Manager* – to manage the application and review process for scholarships was launched. The application cycle for 20231/22 Foundation scholarships opened on March 1 and applications will be accepted through October 1, 2021. More than 200 privately funded scholarships, valued in excess of \$210,000 are offered through the Yuba College and Woodland Community College Funds of the Foundation.
